

What Next - FAQs

Do I need a costume?

YES. All teen participants will have a role in the 20-minute evangelistic drama "Toymaker's Son." You will be assigned a specific costume that you'll be responsible to bring but not necessarily wear yourself. Big World will send out your costume assignment in May with specifics of what that includes. You can check out photos of each costume and detailed costume list below.

Once we get to Miami, you'll find out what role you'll be playing in our drama, and costumes will be exchanged among your teammates. We'll be able to make minor sizing adjustments, but if you follow the directions you'll receive for your costume, it will work! We promise!

*If you don't bring the costume you're assigned, you will be required to pay for us to find something in Miami, which is difficult and time consuming for your leaders.

What is the weather like in July?

Most days in July which is in the period, called winter or the green season, expect a short, heavy downfall once or twice a day. The typical 'winter' weather in Panama City (simply called Panama) starts sunny in the morning. There are usually a few fluffy cumulous clouds on the horizon, perhaps along with some darker ones. By mid-morning, the clouds have moved in over the city, and the rain starts in the early afternoon. It typically lasts for about an hour or soon pass, and the sun will come out again to dry everything off.

The average high temperature in Panama City (most of which is near sea level) has been 87°F (30°C). Average nighttime temperatures vary only slightly throughout the year, between 76°F (24°C) and 78°F (25°C). The highest and lowest temperatures recorded in that period were 102°F (38°C) and 68°F (20°C).

Humidity can take some getting used to in Panama City. Average morning relative humidity has ranged between 87% and 93%. Average afternoon relative humidity has ranged between 59% and 81%.

Where will we stay?

The trip begins in Miami, Fl. While in Florida, we'll stay at a local hotel, typically the Embassy Suites. While in Ecuador, our entire group will stay at a resort-type hotel that is large enough to accommodate and feed us all. Detailed information to come. You'll have access to Internet to stay in touch with friends and family. Your parents will be able to call in by phone if they need to reach you.

*What if I get sick?

We will have a staff of professional medical providers with us just to tend to the needs of our group.

They'll be able to deal with minor illnesses and medical issues.

* What should I pack?

We will email a packing list with your team and costume assignment.
